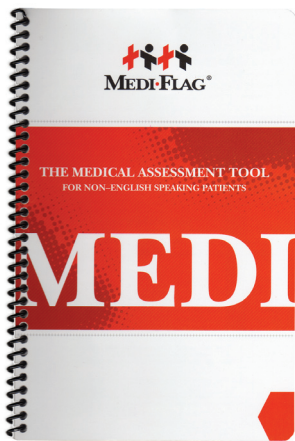


# A GUIDE TO USING MEDIFLAG



## ABOUT MEDIFLAG

The MediFlag booklet is a 24 page re-usable tool that enables medical personnel to conduct an initial medical assessment of a patient who does not speak English. Available in 14 languages, MediFlag is made of a durable laminated material that can be written on with dry erase markers, grease pencils or wax pencils. It can also be sterilized and wiped down with bleach or other industrial strength cleaners.

## HOW TO USE MEDIFLAG

Each MediFlag booklet is based on a YES/NO or numerical answer to the question format. English text is always next to the corresponding foreign language text so the medical professional can simply point to the question for the patient. The patient can also point to the answer, circle the answer or indicate the answer in response. In some cases a family member who is more lucid may be able to answer the questions in the booklet for the patient.



## BOOKLET SECTIONS

The MediFlag booklet is organized in sections based on types of information needed. It is recommended that medical personnel familiarize themselves with the booklet ahead of time so that it is easy to find the appropriate questions in an emergency situation.

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**PATIENT INFORMATION** ■ (Light Green Section) – Covers the basic information about a patient including general information and emergency contact information.

**GENERAL QUESTIONS** ■ (Purple) – Covers recent activities including eating/drinking and medications taken by the patient.

**SYMPTOMS** ■ (Orange) – Covers any symptoms the patient may be experiencing.

**PAIN INDEX** ■ (Red) – Covers the type of pain, level and location on the body.

**CHEST PAIN** ■ (Magenta) – Asks questions specific to heart episodes.

**NEUROLOGY** ■ (Aqua) – Covers neurological related episodes.

**DRUG OVERDOSE** ■ (Yellow) – Covers questions specific to types of drugs and time they were taken.

**BITES AND STINGS** ■ (Dark Blue) – Covers questions specific to type of bite and from what animal.

**OBSTETRICS AND GYNECOLOGY** ■ (Peach) – Covers questions related to pregnancy and gynecological issues.

**PHYSICAL EXAM** ■ (Dark Green) – Asks specific questions of the patient to conduct a physical exam or collect samples.

**MEDICAL HISTORY** ■ (Dark Purple) – Asks specific questions about a patient's medical history.

**PATIENT / DOCTOR REQUESTS** ■ (Olive) – Section where the patient can communicate specific issues or you can communicate specific instructions to the patient.
